

#### Reminders

- Snacks at morning break should be healthy ones such as fruit, vegetables, cheese or yogurt. Crisps, biscuits and chocolate will be sent home, and a healthy alternative offered.
- PE Kit should be plain black/navy bottoms and plain black/navy hoodies/fleece. Grey and white hoodies/sweatshirts are not part of our school PE uniform or colourful leggings.
- A reminder that nail varnish should not be worn in school unless on a themed/non uniform day. Earrings should be studs only, not hoops which should be removed or taped over at home for PE sessions.
  No other jewellery should be worn, and children will be asked to remove this at school and put into bookbags moving forwards.

### **Learning Accord Handwriting Competition**

Last week at the trust leadership day that Joel and Martha B attended, all schools in the Learning Accord Trust were asked to take a piece of handwriting from each year group to enter in to a handwriting competition in the following categories:

Best hand writer and most improved over the year. Awards were given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each category.

We are so proud that we came back with 4 certificates. In 1st place for best hand writer in reception Olive B, in 1st place for best hand writer in year 1 Elspeth, in 2nd place for best hand writer in year 2 Abigail and in 3rd place for most improved hand writer in reception Olivia.

#### **School Meals - Price Increase**

From September 2025 the price of school dinners will increase to £2.85 per day. Children in reception, Year 1 & 2 will continue to receive Universal Infant Free School Meals. Unless your family is in receipt of Statutory (means tested) Free School Meals, all children from Year 3 (in Sept) to Year 5 will need to pay for dinners and ensure that their dinner money accounts are in credit.

### Stockeld Park, Wednesday 16th July

We will travel by coach, leaving school at 9:00am and returning before the end of the school day (providing there are no traffic problems). Children should arrive at school for registration promptly at 8:45am.

The children should come to school in their uniform and should also bring a waterproof coat, sun hat and possibly sun cream.

Please can the children bring a small backpack that they can carry their lunch and water bottle in.

Devices such as the Apple AirTag and electronic watches, that are essentially tracking devices with the capability of sending video footage from the device back to the person tracking i.e. parent that have the potential to post locations of children's whereabouts on social media will not be allowed under any circumstances on school visits and must not be hidden in pockets/bags etc. If any tracking devices are found on pupils the device will be removed and returned to school.
